1) Entry Fees

Competitors

Registration will be R1000 per person competing regardless of the number of events. This includes T-Shirt and social events. Optional SANDF members registration R500.00, will exclude social events.

All competitors entering unofficial events will have their registration reimbursed if unable to compete due to unforeseen circumstances.

2) Jump Rates and Altitudes

There will be 2 jump rates:

0 – 8 200ft = R220

Above 8 200ft = R250

3) Re-jumps

The cost for re-jumps awarded in accordance with discipline / event rules are for the account of the competitor. Re-jumps due to failure in event organisation are for the account of the organiser.

4) Registration

All registration with full payment (registration fees & slot rates) has been extended until **24 April 2013**. Team registration shall include alternatives (if any), videographer and team name. Late registrations will be allowed at a surcharge of 20% on the registration fee. No registrations will be accepted after the first training date or once manifest is posted, whichever comes first.

If an individual or team withdraws from the championship after official registration, they will forfeit an amount of R500 per person. The balance will be repaid within 15 days following the end of the competition. Any team or individual who is grounded for safety or other reasons, will forfeit the full registration fee.

6) First and last Jump

The first competition jump will commence at 7am on the 29th of April 2013 and the last jump will take off not later than 12 noon on the 3rd of May. No jumps other than competition jumps will be allowed between these dates and times.

8) Notice board

The official competition notice board will be in the entrance of the main building left of manifest.

9) Protest Fee

The Protest Fee for 2013 will be R500.

13) Responsibility of the Entrant

ACCEPTANCE OF SPORTING CODE, RULES AND REGULATIONS

The entrants and competitors are required to know, understand, accept and abide by the Sporting Code and the rules and regulations for the event, and by entering are deemed to accept them without reservation. They should appreciate that they represent the National Team of their NAC, or,



in second Category events, are ambassadors for their country and that they should compete in a sporting manner and that their behaviour must be beyond reproach. (AL10)

DOPING, ALCOHOL, ILLNESS AND INJURY (Whole para, AL9) this is a brief outline from the document "FAI Anti-Doping Rules and Procedures", published by FAI and agreed by the World Anti-Doping Agency (WADA) for application to Air Sports.

Definition. Doping consists of the use or attempted use of one or more prohibited substances or methods, or of blood or blood products, or of manipulation aimed at making these difficult to detect. This may be intentional, unintentional, involve negligence or omission, or in any other circumstances. A doping offence is also committed by refusal or failure to comply with doping control testing, tampering with doping control, possession of a prohibited substance or method, or aiding a doping offence.

Policy. FAI policy is to prevent misuse, malpractice and cheating, in this case where doping is concerned. Doping is contrary to the FAI principles of equity and fair play and is potentially damaging to the health and safety of participants in Air Sports. Prohibited Substances. These are those in the WADA standard list valid at the moment of testing (listed on www.wada-ama.org). The FAI also includes alcohol (above a defined level) for flight safety reasons. (AL13)

Competitor responsibilities. All competitors entering sporting events under FAI rules shall accept that they may be required to submit to, and co-operate with, doping control measures. Entrants with a documented medical condition requiring the use of a Prohibited Substance or a Prohibited Method must before the event concerned have obtained a Therapeutic Use Exemption (TUE) in accordance with FAI Anti-Doping rules. In addition, for reasons arising during or immediately before the event, a competitor taking any drug or medication, or suffering from a medical condition, illness or injury, which might either compromise safety or invalidate a licence, must inform the Contest Director in writing before competing.
