1	<p><b>Welcome</b></p>
	<p>DC welcomed all and opened the meeting at 19H00. DC covered housekeeping, meeting rules and noted that the attendance register is being circulated.</p>
2	<p><b>Minutes from the Previous Meeting</b></p>
	<p>Previous minutes were accepted and ratified without objections. Proposed by JB; Seconded by ALR. No matters arising from these minutes were discussed.</p>
3	<p><b>Substituting the Current Constitution with the Redrafted Constitution</b></p>
	<p>DC noted that the redrafted Constitution has been circulated and enquired if anyone had any comments on this. He noted that without Neeve this would not have been possible. Over the years there were many changes made and annexures added on. The Constitution now reflects how PASA is made up. The Management Council was introduced last year and consists of members of ADZO &amp; SSA. Both are essential parties within the operations of PASA. PASA will now be registered as a Public Benefit Organisation to avoid having to pay tax. PASA will have one account. It is not necessary for the PASA account to be audited and accounts are written up by a firm of registered auditors and proper accounting will be done for PASA, SSA &amp; ADZO. Last year the Management Council was introduced. This year it is proposed that the NSTO be included in the MC structure. The NSTO is a vital part of our sport and has to be approved by the CAA for this appointed position. The day to day running of PASA is managed by Neeve and the NSTO who have been the back bone of getting PASA where it is today with a proper structure.</p> <p>In the new Constitution a lot of redrafting has been done including the semantics and to ensure that there are no ambiguities and so that it now reads as one document. Charl Rootman who now lives in Australia gave very useful feedback. DC proceeded to read the proposed amendments.</p> <p>Changes are proposed by PL; Seconded by JB</p> <p>No questions / queries by attendees.</p>
4	<p><b>SSA Committees Reports &amp; New Committee Members</b></p>
	<p>DC noted that in terms of the new Constitution, SSA Committees will in future be required to report back on the past year's activities, present the new Committee members and Activity Plans for the year ahead. South African rules have been presented and they will now go through it to put a proposal together to get it onto the agenda. At the next IPC meeting it will be decided whether or not they will be a separate discipline or part of another discipline.</p> <p><b>Judges</b> Report presented by Sam Schook (attached) Committee Members</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Stuart Robinson (Chairman)</li> <li>• Etienne Bosch</li> </ul> <p><b>ADZO Executive</b> Will only present a report next year as it now included in the Constitution and will be a requirement next year. 5	<p><b>Proposal from SSA to include an amount in the General PASA Membership Fee</b></p> <p>DC noted that the issue of whether SSA fees should be compulsory or not is quite contentious and has been ongoing for quite some time. In terms of the new Constitution, we are now all one. Fees will be paid to PASA, represented by the Management Council, including members from ADZO, SSA and the NSTO. It has been proposed that we have 1 fee paid to PASA and 1 fee to Aero Club. It is then up to the Management Council to decide how the money should be spent. Next year we will have more detail on the proposed budgets so members can be more involved with this. The proposed fees are PASA – R410 &amp; Aero Club – R270. Total fee of R680. The SSA sub-disciplines will then present their plan of activities for the year. DC proposes that the Management Council still uses the tick box system to indicate support of the general members for specific disciplines.</p> <p>PM: Required clarification on how the funds will be split. Will they be weighted differently? DC: The underlying idea is to see that whatever is done is done in the best interest of the sport. The SSA should propose a budget and should they not achieve all objectives, any leftover money will remain in PASA and not accrue to the SSA. In the past the complaint has been that there is never enough money to do anything. ADZO has some ideas with regards to marketing the sport by creating a video and airing the video. ALR: Clarifies that for example CF and FS will not be weighted similarly. It will be based on the general support of the members of that discipline. DC: There has been a lot of criticism about who benefits from equipment bought, competitions, etc. We all learned from it and it will not happen in future. PM: It is a nice thought to get everyone around the table and discuss how funds are allocated, but you will always be partial to your own discipline. DC: The Management Council now have representatives from all areas (ADZO, SSA &amp; NSTO) and this gives you reasonable opportunity to ensure that funds are allocated correctly. MC: There needs to be more clarity on the process of how funds will be allocated. PL: The tick box system will still indicate the amount of money that each discipline gets. It is not a case of the person with the best ideas get the money. JB: Reconfirmed that this is exactly what we (SSA) are doing now. We propose a plan and at the end of the year we report on what you've done. DC: It is still self-regulating. You decide in accordance with your members what your plan for the year is. NL: The tick box system still determines how the money is split. DM: It is now a case of you don't just get the money, you need to come up with a budget first. It is a much simpler process. DC: Can we propose that PASA fee is now one fee of R410? Proposed by ALR; Seconded by JB. Any votes against this proposal? MB: Noted that he carried 10 proxies against this proposal and he needs to vote as per the proxies. BC: Noted that he carried 3 proxies against this proposal.</p>



	<p>PM: Enquired whether the Chairman recommends this proposal. Will this increased number assist the organisation to meet the budgetary requirements? DC replied that it would.</p> <p>JB: This is a driving force from the SSA side so the SSA supports the proposal.</p> <p>CB: Are there any total increases and how has the amounts been put together?</p> <p>DC: R260 for ADZO (R5 increase) &amp; R150 for SSA (no increase)</p> <p>JB: Noted that she carried 2 proxies for the proposal</p> <p>Votes are counted and the motion of one PASA fee has been carried. 13 Proxies against the proposal have been counted. 10 Proxies for the proposal have been counted.</p>
<b>6</b>	<b>To Set the Limits of Expenditures for the Individual Committees</b>
	<p>DC suggested that the limits of expenditures to remain as is. R5 000 for FS &amp; AE and R2 000 for all other disciplines. Proposed by EB; Seconded by ALR</p>
<b>7</b>	<b>Elect Incoming Non-Executive Directors</b>
	<p>NL suggested that the NEDs remain the same as it takes a long time to create continuity.</p> <p>JM suggested that the NEDs serve a minimum of 3 years to assist with continuity.</p> <p>DC clarified that the NEDs resign every year at the AGM and become available for re-election if they so wish.</p> <p>All Non-Executive Directors indicated that they are prepared to continue for another year. Accepted unanimously.</p>
<b>8</b>	<b>General</b>
	<p>DC noted that NEDs and Committee members are often criticised and some of the criticism is valid. Committee members before they accept appointment should appreciate that they are responsible and accountable to the members They need to communicate more with their members and encourage members to give more input to help the committee deliver on their promises.</p> <p>PL thanked DC for all the work he has put into redrafting the constitution. DC thanked Neeve for all her work and also noted that MB's work sometimes goes unnoticed. A big vote of thanks to him.</p>

Aside from a number of first CF introductions around the country by CF coaches, there was one formal CF camp held in Rustenburg on 12/13 June 2010, in a somewhat different format than the usual skills camp. A combined Nationals and developmental competition was held. Events were the standard 4-way Rotation and 2-way Sequential as well as an unofficial 2-way Rotation event judged ground-to-air. The senior CF jumpers put themselves into teams with intermediate and junior jumpers. Reports on this published in Toggle Times and on the PASA website.

Funds available for such events remain a problem, thus CF funds were only utilize to fund some of the Judges' expenses. Jumpers all paid their own slots.

A second and final event for the year is a skills camp requested by JSC for the last weekend of March 2011. This has not been included in the financials below.

### 1.1. Evaluation Report

The Atmo Committee is happy to announce a well received competition (14 expected participants, 12 effective competitors), with a fair degree of skill presented by the competitors. It will remain a future requirement for the development of Atmo videographers. A fair degree of improvement was also shown by the intermediate competitors. In future, it is hoped that more participation will be forthcoming from KZN.

In general, the quality of video and completion of sequences has improved since Atmo Nationals 2009, which indicates a gradual all-round improvement of skills, especially in the advanced category.

We would like to thank the competitors (including 2 from the Cape, 1 from KZN, 4 from Pretoria, 5 from JHB) for their participation and good sportsmanship shown. A big thank you also to the pool videographers, without whom the competition would not have been possible.

The Atmo Committee would like to thank the meet director (Jo), for her invaluable support, and her commitment to assist the competitors in terms of load organising, communication with ALS, confirmation of safe landings for each team on every load, and her general successful running of operations.

A big thank you also goes out to JSC for the use of its facilities, JSC Staff (especially manifest officer/s), the PAC Partnership, the support of PASA, NED's and the SSA, and the Judges – for their participation, availability, and advice & support in terms of ongoing improvements to the rules documents for future events.

This competition represents the 3<sup>rd</sup> Atmo Nationals competition (including the 1<sup>st</sup> Demo Event, Nylstroom), the 2<sup>nd</sup> of which was held at Mafikeng, and this latest Nationals held in Carletonville, with the specific view to hold the next two rounds in KZN and the Cape, with the view to promote the discipline in other parts of the country.

# Activity Plan 2010/11

## *Judges*

The judges Committee currently has R15 948 in its portfolio and has been raised through fees charged for nationals. These funds have been earmarked for re-currency courses and new judges training for interested individuals. The current judges have previously funded their own training and have collectively established an international reputation for competent judges. We currently have 7 FAI rated judges for AE, 4 FAI rated judges for FS, 3 FAI rated for CP and 1 for CF.
